VOTE—IT MAKES A DIFFERENCE

As a reminder, ballots must be mailed in by November 6th at 8:00 pm. The Political Action Committee wants to reiterate what can happen when we get our members to vote. In just one year, we were able to pass SB 6126 requiring the completion of a state recognized apprenticeship to get a Journeyman License, SB 5493 setting prevailing wage based on our union negotiated wage, passed initiative 1433 securing paid sick leave for all workers, and SB 5975 guaranteeing paid family medical leave for all workers. All of these things happened because we voted. We can do more in the next year, and all it takes is voting for representatives who will represent us. . The PAC mailed out questionnaires, interviewed candidates, and coordinated with other local and state unions to help us discover who will best serve the interests of Local 112 members. Every American has the right to vote, and to vote for whomever they believe will best represent them. Our goal has been to help each member make an informed decision at this critical time in our history. Voting is one of the most powerful tools we have to fight for our right to make a decent, dignified living. We can and do make a difference that affects all of our livelihoods. Thank you for fighting alongside your 112 Brothers and Sisters.

Visit this site for some good information on scissor lift safety. Remember the side load pulling and pushing on a scissor lift is very low. Make sure you are aware of the side load force your lift is rated for. Keep yourself inside the platform perimeter and always shut the stop button off when you are in position to work or leave the lift.

We've had a couple of scissor lift accidents in the last couple of years and I would recommend you take the time to become familiar with scissor lift safety.

I also took part in the CONNECT Tri-Cities event at the convention center where we talked to high school students about going into apprenticeship programs. I tended to steer them away from programs like Perry Tech in favor of our training program.

In late September, Business Manager Swayze and I attended the Joint Washington and Oregon State Association of Electrical Workers Conference. During the conference, it was reported that the 9th District is the largest district within the IBEW with approximately 135,000 members. John O'Rourke, 9th District Vice President, stated that our goal is to have 150,000 members before the IBEW International Convention in 2021.

During September, LU 112 contacted 29 future members, four contractors and welcomed eleven new members.
